

**AUGUST 19, 2019 PUBLIC SAFETY COMMITTEE MEETING MINUTES  
CITY OF EDGERTON**

Jim Burdick called the meeting to order at 6:12 p.m. Committee members present were Jim Burdick, Anne Radtke, and David Esau. Also present were Police Chief Robert Kowalski, City Administrator Ramona Flanigan, Mayor Christopher Lund, and Alderperson Candy Davis.

Chief Kowalski confirmed the agendas were properly posted on Friday, August 16, 2019 at the Post Office, Edgerton Library and City Hall.

**APPROVAL OF PUBLIC SAFETY MINUTES:**

A Radtke/Esau motion to approve the July 1, 2019 Public Safety Committee meeting minutes passed, all voted in favor.

**DISCUSS ISSUANCE OF NARCAN/NALOXONE TO OFFICERS:**

Chief Kowalski stated that Narcan is a drug that is used for opioid overdoses. Narcan immediately awakes the individual from the overdose. The Chief stated that the Aids Resource Center of Wisconsin provided enough Narcan for each officer to carry two nasal doses to administer in the event of an opioid overdose. The Chief is currently creating a policy for the issuance of Narcan to officers.

**DISCUSS AND CONSIDER ACTION PLAN USING SPEED HUMPS:**

Chief Kowalski stated that the officers participate in “Click it or Ticket”, which makes the department eligible for a traffic control grant. One of the qualifications of the grant is to attend training which Chief Kowalski and Lt. Meehan recently attended. Typically speed humps aren’t included as part of the grant but Chief Kowalski stated that they put together an action plan with traffic data to justify the purchase of speed humps and are awaiting to hear whether they are approved or not.

**DISCUSS STALKER RADAR DATA:**

Chief Kowalski stated that the data collected from the stalker radar is very useful. They plan to continue to use the radar in different areas within the City.

**POLICE CHIEFS REPORT:**

Chief Kowalski stated that himself and Lt. Meehan participated in “Cop on Top” that was held at Dunkin Donuts in Newville. They were able to collect \$580.73 in donations.

Chief Kowalski also stated that the department is participating in “Drive Sober or Get Pulled Over”, which focuses on OWI’s and also qualifies the department for a grant.

Alderperson Burdick expressed how pleased he is with the success of National Night Out. Chief Kowalski stated that they plan to hold it again next year.

Being no other business before the Public Safety Committee, a / motion to adjourn passed, all voted in favor.
