Downtown Ash Tree Removal

If you have been in downtown Edgerton lately, you have probably noticed that the Ash trees have been removed. It was truly sad to see these 30-yearold trees removed, but the Emerald Ash Borer proved to be as relentless as predicted. A few years after the insect was discovered in Michigan, Edgerton began inoculating the downtown Ash trees in an effort to protect them from the borer. These efforts, however, proved to be insufficient, and the trees were ultimately diagnosed as infested with the borer. Therefore, in March of this year, the Department of Public Works removed the trees, yet they did so in a manner that will make maximum use of the timber.

The trunks of these trees were left in long pieces so that they could be con-

verted to lumber. The City received a WDNR Urban Forestry Grant to mill the wood. The rough sawn wood will be dried in a solar kiln that was recently constructed by high school Technology Education students. Once the lumber is dry, the City and the school will use the wood for projects. We are hopeful that we can develop an ongoing program to convert trees that must be removed into useful products. So maybe the next time you sit at a picnic table in the park, you may be again enjoying one of Edgerton's street trees.



The last step in this process—the one that completes the cycle—is to replant trees in the downtown. The new trees will be planted this summer.

Home Compost Bins Sale

Based on strong citizen interest in home composting, the City purchased 76 home compost bins with a plan to sell them to residents at cost. There are two different sized bins: an 80-gallon bin costs \$41, and a 125-gallon bin costs \$46. The bins will be sold on a first-come/first-serve basis.

Starting April 5, 2021, you can reserve a bin by submitting your payment to City Hall. The receipt you receive with your purchase will be your "ticket" to pick up a bin. (If you put your payment in the drop box at City Hall, we will mail you your receipt.) Bins will be distributed from Fassett Cemetery starting May 1. Pickup hours will coincide with the hours of operation of the compost site. Check the City's website for compost site hours. More detailed instructions regarding bin pickup will be provided at the time you make your purchase.

2021 Construction Projects

There are several street projects planned for this summer. Here are a few to keep an eye on:

South Main Street from Lord Street to Hain Road (Phase

- <u>1</u>). This is the first year of an enormous two year project. The 2021 project will replace the sewer and water infrastructure in the entire corridor and will take most of the summer to complete. The street will be open to local traffic only. Funding for a portion of the sanitary sewer is being provided by USDA Rural Development.
- <u>Cherry Street, Nunn Bush Street, and East Hubert Street</u> will all be resurfaced. The project will include some minor sanitary sewer structure and curb repair in addition to

the pavement resurfacing.

Many <u>downtown crosswalks and curb ramps</u> will be replaced downtown. This may require some temporary traf-

- fic rerouting.
- <u>Highway Striping</u> will be updated on both Fulton and Main Streets.

<u>Lead Lateral Replacement.</u> The City has applied to WDNR's Private Lead Service Replacement Grant Program. The City is optimistic that we will receive grant funding to replace several private lead service laterals.

<u>New subdivisions</u>. There are several potential new subdivisions under construction this year.

Polls will be open at City Hall on April 6, 2021 Election Day from 7:00 am to 8:00 pm. You still have time to absentee vote if you do not wish to vote at the polls on Election Day.

Request an absentee ballot online at myvote.wi.gov prior to April 2nd, and a ballot will be mailed to you. Voters may also email or mail a written request with a photo ID (scan or copy) to the City Clerk for a ballot to chegglund@cityofedgerton.com. Please be sure to allow for mailing time, as the ballot must be returned on or before Election Day.

Voters can also vote in-person via absentee ballot at City Hall through Friday, April 2nd until 5:00 pm.
